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The RSPCA aims to promote kindness and prevent cruelty to animals. The Society's **free** education service plays a leading role by:

- supporting teachers to develop informed, responsible and active citizens
- helping schools to become more animal friendly.



The RSPCA education team can offer you...

School-based training:

- schemes of work linked to the National Curriculum and tailored to meet your school's needs
- support with embedding animal welfare into medium-term plans.

Work with school councils:

- raising awareness of animal welfare issues and taking action.

INSET and Initial Teacher Training (ITT):

- raising awareness of animals and animal welfare issues
- active participation in workshops showing how animal welfare can be used as a focus or context for the delivery of the National Curriculum.

INSET is available to groups of teachers in a twilight session or in either a half or full-day workshop.

ITT is available to: universities offering PGCE, BEd, BSc/BA with QTS; SCITT and GTP providers; as part of local authority support days; and NQTs.
